Towanda's 1st Post Office?

"Mr. and Mrs. Ike Davis and Florence Bolton, who lived with them a few years. Isaac V. Davis was born in 1850 and died 1935. He was the 2nd mail carrier at Towanda. Chase Orban assisted by Ott Thomas being the 1st. The Davis house was built by Tucker, Hays, Huddleston and Davis. It housed the first Post Office in Towanda. The Davis's added the west part later. Ike was a school teacher and worked for Elmer Robison, then J.C. Robison before carrying the mail. He took the route in 1905 using horse and mail wagon." - Wilson Scrapbook.

It is our best guess this house still stands on 2nd street and has beautiful woodwork interior. TAHM has records indicating our first postmaster as Daniel Cupp, although he may not have been registered accordingly as they did at later dates. Mr. Cupp's service started prior to the founding of Towanda. #storyoftowanda

INTRODUCTION

Under the Kansas Open Meetings Act (KOMA), the public has the right to observe the meetings of the Towanda City Council, unless the City Council has recessed into a lawfully conducted executive session. The KOMA does not require the opportunity for public comment – that opportunity is provided at the discretion of the City Council, except as required by State law or City ordinance in certain specific circumstances. This policy outlines the various circumstances under which the City Council meets and elaborates on the City Council's Rules of Procedure by addressing the rules regarding the time, place, and manner of public participation in the City Council meetings from the standpoint of the participating member of the public. This policy is intended to strike a lawful balance between First Amendment protections and the substantial public interests of (1) assuring that meetings of the City Council can occur in an efficient, orderly, and safe manner and (2) promoting productive public discourse regarding the governance and administration of the City while maintaining decorum in an environment free from interference, distraction, or intimidation, whether real or perceived, by any person present in the meeting room toward the Council or members of the public.

SUBMISSION OF WRITTEN INFORMATION

Written information may be submitted to the City Clerk before noon on the Thursday prior to a City Council meeting for distribution to Council and key staff members or may be presented during the meeting upon recognition by the Mayor as a speaker in the manner described below. Ten (10) copies should be provided to ensure that all applicable parties are able to receive and review the information provided.

FORMS OF COMMUNICATION OR EXPRESSION NOT ALLOWED IN THE MEETING ROOM

To assure fulfillment of the substantial public interests outlined above, no member of the public attending the City Commission meeting shall in the meeting room engage in the following forms of communication or expression found by the City Council to be in conflict with the substantial public interests outlined above and, therefore, not allowed in the meeting room (the "disallowed conduct"):

Before, during, or after the meeting:

(1) Possessing, placing, or displaying a sign, placard, flag, or banner, regardless of its size, the material of which it is made, or its written, graphic, or symbolic content;

During the meeting:

- (2) Audibly speaking, or making any sound or noise other than while speaking as a speaker recognized by the mayor;
- (3) Applauding, whistling, cheering, clapping, or otherwise expressing agreement with a speaker recognized by the mayor;
- (4) Booing, jeering, taunting, ridiculing, mocking or otherwise expressing disagreement with a speaker recognized by the mayor;
- (5) Inaudibly mouthing or gesturing messages deemed to be distracting to other persons in the meeting room;
- (6) Making available or distributing written materials to those in attendance.

Persons attending a City Commission meeting must turn off or set on vibrate all cellular telephones. Any person exhibiting any form of the disallowed conduct will first be warned by the Mayor to cease. If the person continues the disallowed conduct, the Mayor may ask the person to leave the meeting room. If the person does not promptly leave the meeting room, the Mayor may direct that the person be escorted from the meeting room.

AGENDA ITEMS

CONSENT AGENDA

The Consent Agenda assembles routine action items for collective approval in the interest of efficiency of the meeting. Any item may be removed from the Consent Agenda for separate consideration either (a) at the request of a Council Member or City staff, or (b) by a majority vote of the City Council upon request by a Towanda resident directed to City staff or to a Council Member prior to the start of the meeting without discussion.

PRESENTATIONS AND GUEST SPEAKERS

Presentations and Guest Speakers Time is an opportunity for organizations or citizens to make special presentations before the City Council. Such are scheduled in advance of the meeting by calling the City Clerk Andy Newbrey at (316) 536-2243 by 5:00 pm the Thursday preceding the meeting. Presentations are limited to ten minutes. Any presentation is for information purposes only; no action will be taken.

PUBLIC HEARINGS AND REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS

Following the introduction of any public hearing or regular agenda item, consideration of the item will ordinarily begin with a staff report followed by Council Member questions of staff. If the matter involves an applicant, the applicant or the applicant's representative will be given the opportunity to address the City Council.

In the case of a public hearing, the public hearing shall be conducted in the manner required by State law or Towanda ordinance and any person entitled to address the City Council shall be provided that opportunity, regardless of his or her viewpoint on the matter, subject to the allowed time period.

In the case of a regular agenda item, subject to the discretion of the City Council, any interested persons wishing to address the City Council regarding the subject of the agenda item, regardless of his or her viewpoint on the matter, may be given the opportunity to do so, subject to the allowed time period.

In the case of either a public hearing or regular agenda item, those allowed to address the City Council may do so by, in turn, approaching the podium to be recognized by the mayor.

- Upon recognition by the Mayor, the speaker must indicate his or her name and city of residence and may address the subject of the agenda item for no longer than the allowed time period which is typically three (3) minutes but may be altered and announced by the Mayor based upon the number of persons expected to speak during the public hearing or regular agenda item.
- While addressing the City Council, the speaker may request permission from the Mayor to distribute any written information regarding the subject of the agenda item to City Council Members, the City Administrator/City Clerk.
- The speaker should avoid repeating what has already been said and should feel free to simply state whether he or she is or is not in support of the matter being discussed.
- A speaker should not expect to engage in two-way dialogue with the City Council.
- A speaker should provide his or her comments for Council consideration at their discretion.

PUBLIC COMMENT TIME

Public Comment Time provides an opportunity for Towanda citizens to address the City Council on a topic that is not on the meeting agenda.

After the Mayor announces the Public Comment Time:

- Any citizen wishing to address the City Council should, in turn, approach the podium to be recognized by the Mayor.
- There are no residency requirements.
- Upon recognition by the Mayor, the speaker must indicate his or her name and city of residence and may address the City Council for no longer than the allowed time period which is typically three (3) minutes but may be altered and announced by the Mayor based upon the number of persons expected to speak during the Public Comment Time.

- While addressing the City Council, the speaker may request permission from the Mayor to distribute any written information to Council Members, the City Manager, and the City Clerk.
- The City Council is not expected to take immediate action in response to the presentation.
- At the discretion of the City Council, subjects introduced under Public Comment Time may be referred to City staff for follow-up or may become an agenda item for a future meeting.
- A speaker should not expect to engage in two-way dialogue with the City Council.
- A speaker should provide his or her comments for Council consideration at their discretion.
 - o Comments or questions will be directed only to the City Council.
- Debate or arguments between parties in the audience is not allowed.
- Comments on personnel matters and matters pending in court are not permitted.

In order for the Council to have an opportunity to review comments in advance of the meeting, please email your comments or questions to administrator@cityoftowanda.com by 5:00 p.m. the Tuesday prior to the Wednesday meetings.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Kansas Open Meetings Act allows the City Council to recess into an executive session based upon certain justifications outlined in the act. The City Council may recess into executive session based upon a motion that includes (1) a statement describing the subjects to be discussed during the executive session, (2) the statutory justification for the executive session, and (3) the time and place at which the open meeting shall resume. Executive sessions are closed to the public, however, once the executive session has concluded, members of the public may return to the meeting room.

AGENDA INFORMATION

Copies of the agenda are available on the Friday afternoon preceding the regular meetings. Items for the agenda should be submitted to the Towanda City Clerk's office prior to noon on the Thursday preceding a regularly scheduled Wednesday meeting. Information regarding the agenda may be obtained from City Hall, 110 S. 3rd, Towanda, KS, or by visiting our website at: www.cityoftowanda.com/agendas-minutes

OTHER ITEMS

STUDY/WORKSHOP SESSION

The City Council may meet in study session on topics determined by the City Administrator or the City Council on a specific date and time. As the name suggests, the study/workshop session is intended to provide a less formal opportunity for the City Council to study, discuss, and provide direction to City staff regarding the subject under study. Study sessions are open to the public; however, the extent of public participation is subject to the discretion of the City Council based upon available time during the study session and the need for public input in order to accomplish the objectives of the City Council in studying the subject of the study session.

SPECIAL LIMITED PUBLIC FORUM

A special limited public forum may be called by the City Council for the purposes of

- (a) conducting public discussion and
- (b) seeking public comment and/or the submission of written information regarding a particular subject matter.

A special limited public forum may be convened in the City Council's regular meeting room or at an alternative, publicly accessible site suitable for the anticipated number of participants in the forum.

At the appointed time on the agenda, any persons wishing to address the City Council regarding the subject of the special limited public forum, regardless of their viewpoint on the matter, may do so by, in turn, approaching the podium or microphone to be recognized by the Mayor.

- Upon recognition by the Mayor, the speaker must indicate his or her name and city of residence and may address the subject of the special limited public forum for no longer than the allowed time period determined and announced by the mayor based upon the number of persons expected to speak during the forum.
- While addressing the City Council, the speaker may request permission from the Mayor to distribute any written information regarding the subject of the special limited public forum to the City Council, the City Administrator, and the City Clerk.

City Superintendent Sam French noted the high cost of the valve and that upon discussions with a Kansas Rural Water Association (KRWA) representative, the valve may not be required. If it is not, they will not install one to save on costs.
- Mr. French noted the expected date of October 1, 2023 for the Pine Ridge Estates Mobile
 Home Park master meter and that he intends to install it immediately, hopefully in time
 for the October 15, 2023 meter reading cycle.
- Kendall Pierce asked if there was any update on the core sample testing at 322 Main St. No update has been received from the state.
- Mayor Shaults inquired about the dark street light at SW River Valley Rd. and Highway 254. Mr. Newbrey noted that after months of efforts to fix the light, it was damaged by an accident this week. Discussion ensued concerning the safety concerns with that intersection and the K254 Corridor Development Association efforts into the entire corridor.

- Darrell White requested that when a contract is drafted there be a contingency included that would permit the museum provide a notice (perhaps 90 days) to reclaim use of the leased portion.
- Representatives from the museum board conveyed their desire for the museum to keep ownership of the portion in order to possibly expand the museum to that area and that they desire monetary compensation as part of the lease of the portion of property. They noted that they have a meeting scheduled for October to discuss this subject further.

- Museum board member Tricia Lee noted the museum's upcoming High Tea event and Cookie
 Decorating class, as well as Halloween and Christmas plans.
- Proposed land development workshop set for Wednesday, October 4, 2023 at 6:00pm at City Hall.
- Mr. Newbrey presented a proposed ordinance to cover loud noises.
 - Mayor Shaults noted that there were currently very few city codes or ordinances covering excessive noise, and therefore law enforcement has not been able to issue citations for reports of such.
 - Bill Wolf noted his concern with the included timeframes.
 - Darrell White noted that he believed this should pass through the Planning Commission first.
 - City Attorney Rob Lane conveyed that he believed he would have no issue prosecuting a proposed situation of loud dirt bikes under item 1. that did not include a timeframe.



INTERLOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this	day of	, by and t	etween the
Board of County Commissioners of Butler County,	Kansas, hereinafte	er referred to as the "County"	", and the City
of Towanda, Kansas, hereinafter referred to as the "C	City".		

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City is desirous of securing the assistance of trained law enforcement officers to serve on a regularly scheduled basis in the capacity of City Marshal to enforce city ordinances and serve municipal court process; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Butler County, Kansas has agreed through its Sheriff's Office to provide such assistance upon terms negotiated between the parties; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of all parties to reduce their agreement to writing;

NOW THEREFORE, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. The County agrees through the Sheriff of the County, to provide police protection as prescribed in this agreement within the corporate limits of the City designated herein. Such police protection shall encompass the duties and functions of the type coming within the jurisdiction and customarily rendered by the Sheriff of a County and a City Marshal or Police Officer under statues of this State and the ordinances of the City to this agreement. The County intends to perform its obligations to the City generally as follows:
 - A. The County shall designate and identify to the City, TWO Deputies whose job duties are essentially to be full-time to service the needs of the City participating in this agreement. The anticipated average hours per week that each Deputy shall work full-time to the services of such City is Forty-Two and one-half hours (42.50). The Deputies designated shall at all times remain the employees of the Sheriff and not the employees of the City.
 - B. Notwithstanding the obligations of the designated Deputies to the City of Towanda created herein, all parties agree that the Sheriff reserves the right to remove a designated Deputy from City service to County service in the event an emergency condition temporarily compels the return of the Deputy to County service. However, it is the expectation of both parties that Deputies assigned to patrol the City of Towanda shall remain in the City unless called out by a superior officer for emergencies. It is further the expectation of both parties that the Deputy would then return to the City when available and after the emergency has been stabilized.
 - C. The Deputies designated to fulfill the County's obligation herein shall devote such time to the affairs of the City as the Deputies, the County, and the governing body of the City deem necessary. In the event of dispute as to the adequacy of the Deputies service, the decision of the Butler County Sheriff shall control.
 - D. While on City patrol, the Deputies shall enforce the criminal and traffic statues of the State of Kansas, the criminal and traffic ordinances of the City, and the City code enforcement when necessary. It shall be expectation of the parties that alleged misdemeanor matters of all levels as well as traffic infractions and code enforcement matters shall be processed through Municipal Court. Any incident that includes a felony shall be processed through the County Attorney's office.

- E. In addition to providing police and traffic/criminal enforcement, the designated Deputies shall serve summonses, warrants, and other process properly and legally issued by the City's municipal court. The Deputies shall attend municipal court sessions as needed and from time to time shall attend City Council meetings or as required.
- F. The City of Towanda has previously transferred the titles of three (3) police vehicles over to Butler County. It is further agreed that in the event that this agreement is cancelled by either party, three (3) vehicles will be returned to the City of Towanda. The City of Towanda agrees to the maintenance and upkeep of any equipment purchased by the City of Towanda for the purpose of law enforcement and used by the Butler County Sheriff's Office. Otherwise, any equipment purchased by Butler County or the Butler County Sheriff's Office shall be maintained by said Office.
- G. The City of Towanda will provide current police office space and office equipment contained within for the use of the designated Deputies. In addition the City will furnish citation (commonly known as "ticket") books, office supplies (i.e.: pens, pencils, paper), PBT's, as well as other items deemed necessary to conduct City business. In addition the designated Deputies will be allowed to use the City owned police equipment that is currently owned by the City. The City of Towanda agrees to the maintenance and upkeep of any equipment purchased by the City of Towanda for the purpose of law enforcement and used by the Butler County Sheriff's Office. In the event that this agreement is cancelled by either party, all City owned property will remain with the City. The Sheriff will provide uniforms, and such other equipment and support as may be necessary to fulfill the terms of this agreement.
- 2. The County Administrator will present an estimate of the next year's costs of TWO deputies. Using this estimate, the City will pay 100% of the salary of the TWO deputies and 70% of the costs of benefits. This will be the total estimated cost. In the event that less than TWO Deputies are scheduled/available, the City will pay the appropriate and proportional lesser percentage of the total estimated cost (e.g. if only one Deputy is scheduled/available, then City shall pay 50% less than the total estimated cost of TWO Deputies). The City shall be afforded the right to request special assignment of an extra Deputy or Deputies for special events or special circumstances with reasonable notice to the Sheriff. If the Sheriff is able to accommodate this request and assign the "plus Deputy or Deputies" then the compensation to be paid from the City to the County will be the equivalent of the hourly compensation for a Deputy only and will not include any consideration for partial benefits. Except in extreme emergencies, the Deputies will advise the City before performing any duties that would result in overtime pay. If a designated Deputy is requested for assistance in the County past his/her normal City shift, the County will be assessed the overtime for that Deputy. In the event that any designated officer is absent from City duty for any reason, any City emergency or complaint will be responded to by the closest Sheriff's Deputy.
- 3. The City through its officers, agents, and employees, agrees to give the Sheriff's Deputies its full cooperation, and to provide a municipal court system with a designated municipal Judge, a designated Attorney to prosecute all contested municipal cases, and a designated court clerk to supervise the court docket and to take responsibility for all court records. In the event of a lack of a municipal court system as agreed herein, it is agreed that City Ordinances will not be enforced by the Deputies. The City shall provide a designated space/building for the Sheriff's Department inside the city limits. Any and all costs for this space/building shall be equally divided between the Sheriff's Department and the City of Towanda (including but not limited to insurance, utilities, regular maintenance, etc.).
- 4. The City requiring the enforcement of its municipal ordinances, the governing body shall commission the designated Deputies as a City Police Officer.

- 5. The City shall not be called upon to assume any liability for direct payment of any salary, wage, or other compensation to any designated Deputy. The City shall not be liable for compensation or indemnity to any designated Deputy for injury or sickness arising out of his/her employment.
- The County, through this agreement, shall not be deemed to assume any liability for intentional or negligent acts of the City, or of any officer or employee thereof other than the designated Deputy pursuant to this agreement.
- 7. All persons employed in the performance of such services and functions for said City under the terms of this agreement shall be County employees, and no person employed hereunder shall have any City pension, status, or right to City employment.
- 8. The cost to the City shall be paid out of that portion of the General Fund budgeted for police purposes and funded by the general levy of said City or other appropriate means of funding subject to the limitation of paragraph #9.
- 9. Any indebtedness or obligation of the City pursuant to this contract shall never exceed the amount of funds actually on hand in the treasurer of the City for such purpose. In addition, this agreement shall be construed to be in compliance with Article Eleven Chapter 10 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and any construction contrary to the provision of the above mentioned statues shall make this agreement null and void.
- 10. This agreement shall take effect on the ______ day of ______, ____ after its execution by the City and the County and unless terminated shall automatically renew for successive periods of one (1) year with renewals being deemed to commence on January 1st. Either party may terminate this agreement by giving written notice to all parties by not later than June 1st in the year prior to termination (ex. June 1st termination notice will terminate the agreement at midnight, December 31st). Unless otherwise agreed through subsequent written agreement, the termination of this agreement by any party shall terminate the agreement as to all parties.
- 11. This agreement shall be collectively reviewed by the signatory parties, or their legal successors or agents, at least every two (2) years beginning no later than March 31st of 2025 and no later than March 31st of every odd year thereafter. The signatory parties may agree in writing that a collective review be waived in the event that no party has any requested modifications or concerns to be discussed and potentially addressed.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, this agreement is signed by the Mayor of the City of Towanda Kansas and attested by the Clerk of the City of Towanda Kansas upon direction and approval of the Towanda City Council, and signed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, the Butler County Sheriff, and attested by the County Clerk by order of the Board of County Commissioners all on the day and year first written above.

Resolution 2023-12

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING BILLING RATES FOR METERED SALES OF WATER FROM THE CITY OF TOWANDA WATER SYSTEM TO LICENSED MANUFACTURED HOME PARKS CONSISTING OF FOUR OR MORE LICENSED LOTS.

WHEREAS Ordinance 704 provides for the amending of established charges for the sales of metered water by the governing body of the City of Towanda.

WHEREAS the governing body of the City of Towanda has identified a need to update the pricing structure for licensed manufactured home parks consisting of four or more Licensed Lots.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that beginning November 5th, 2023:

- 1. The City shall read only the Park's single Master-Meter
- 2. Charges per month for master-metered residential water sales shall be as follows:
 - a. WA Water:
 - i. For customers within the city limits:
 - 1. \$11.30 base fee per Occupied Residential Structure
 - 2. \$8.30 for every 1,000 gallons used
 - b. WP Water Protection Fee
 - i. \$.032 per 1,000 gallons (As Required by the Kansas Department of Revenue)
 - c. S1 Sewer
 - i. Billed per water usage units as follows
 - 1. \$5.75 base fee per Occupied Residential Structure
 - 2. \$4.36 for every 1,000 gallons used
 - d. SL Sewer Lagoon
 - i. Billed at \$13.00 per Occupied Residential Structure (As per Resolution 2023-02)
 - e. SI Street Impact
 - i. Billed at \$8.25 per Occupied Residential Structure (As per Resolution 2009-05)
 - f. TR Trash
 - i. Billed at \$21.00 per Occupied Residential
 - 1. Provides one trash cart *and* one recycle cart per occupied residential structure.
 - 2. No carts shall be left on vacant lots or unoccupied residential structures.
 - ii. \$15.00 for each additional trash or recycle cart.
- 3. Late Fees: A late Fee of 10% of total outstanding amounts due shall be applied for payments received after the 20th of each month
- 4. **Service Disconnection:** The due amount must be paid by the last day of each month. If payment has not been received, service shall be disconnected on the first day of the following month.
