#### Planning for the Future – Three Plans

- 1. The Comprehensive Plan
  - a. Our last Comprehensive Plan was completed in 2009
    - i. It expired in 2013
    - ii. Foster Design Associates, LLC is helping us to update the plan. (We've already paid that fee.)
    - iii. A new Community Survey is going out after this meeting

A Comprehensive Plan is an expression of the community's vision for the future and a	
strategic map to reach that vision. Comprehensive planning is an important tool for cities to guide future development of land to ensure a safe, pleasant, and economical environment for residential, commercial, industrial, and public activities. Planning can help:

#### City of Towanda Parks and Recreation Board

- Chapter 12, Article 1, Section 12-102. Same; board.
  - board consisting of not more man seven members who saint provide advice and guidance to the governing body on all matters pertaining to the use of, maintenance of, and development of city parks and recreational facilities and shall have such other functions and authority as delegated by the governing body. Appointments to such board shall be made by the governing body as follows:

    - (c) Two members to serve one year;
      (d) After the initial term of appointment, all members of such board shall serve four-year terms.

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- Street Improvements Maintenance Dept. Related
  - o Potholes everywhere
  - o 6th Street needs major re-working.
  - O Highland, between 9th & 11th (?)
  - o Main & 3rd St. Intersection
  - O The shoulders of the street in the old part of town continue to break down. (Traffic Count Coming)
  - See Map of Streets Assessment as of January 15th, 2024

#### Capital Improvement Issues

- 6th and Main Intersection Maintenance Dept. Related
  - $\circ$  Needs a push-button lighted crosswalk.
    - \$6,800 per set of two (2) lights
      - Money probably comes from: ?

- Lighted Stop Signs at 3rd & Main Maintenance Dept.
- o Approx. \$4,000 for a set of two (2)
  - Money probably comes from: ?

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#### Capital Improvement Issues

- Our City Lagon
  Our lagoon has a 30-year lifespan. We are in our 15th year.
  P.E.C., the engineering company that designed it, is recommending we start planning NOW.
  At year 20, we need to do sediment depth testing.
  What do we need to do to expand its life and capacity?
  P.E.C. will work with us, for a fee, to figure out what we need to do and when to do it....And, how much it's going to cost us...

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#### Capital Improvement Issues

- The Gas Station Property Maintenance Dept. Related

   As of January 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024, the State of Kansas has denied our property tax exemption request.
  - We have failed to show how we are using or will use the property for City programs
  - OAs of the same date, we owe:
    - **\$2,078.06** for 2022
    - ■\$1,545.22 for 2023

      - They highly recommend a vapor barrier if we build on the site. We don't know what "vapor barrier" means yet...
